## EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA)

Enacted December 2015

Directs flexibility and authority for states around:

• Accountability systems, interventions, and other programs – including

• Qualifications for program operators, directors, and staff; Assessment system

• Policies for ESSA; Authority over other programs requiring states to report

• ESSA implementation; ESSA implementation; ESSA implementation; ESSA implementation

ESSA requires state standards aligned with college and career skills

## WHAT IS TITLE I

Title I is a federally funded K-12 program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students.

The intent of the program is to provide additional resources so that all students meet state academic standards.

SALT LAKE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT has Schoolwide Title I & Targeted Assistance Programs.

## TITLE I FUNDS

Funds are distributed to schools based on the number of students eligible for free/ reduced lunch.

Funds must supplement, not supplant, district funds.

One percent of a school's total Title I budget is for parental engagement activities.

### Data Analysis is Required for Title I Programs

- Schools analyze many different data sources:
  - RISE
  - ACADIENCE
  - End of Level Assessments
  - Formative Assessments
- Schools use the data to set goals and align curricula to State and District academic standards.
- Schools adjust instructional practices, professional development, and activities to reach goals based on the findings of the assessment data.

### Plan for Student Achievement

- Using the Data Analysis, the school develops a yearlong plan that is organized into goals, actionable steps, and budget needs.
- It is in this plan that the school determines how best to use its Title I Funds.

### Parent Engagement Policy

- Every Title I school, in collaboration with parents, must prepare a site-level parent engagement policy.

- The Parent Engagement Policy describes how the school will involve the parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely way in the planning, review, and improvement of the Title I program at the school.

### School/Parent Compact

The School/Parent Compact describes the responsibilities of the school, the parent, and the student for improved student achievement;

- Developed in collaboration among parents, teachers, and students • Updated periodically;

- Distributed with school Title I Parent Engagement Policy.
